RIGGING & EQUIPMENT

Engine Cooling Pump Submitted by Leo Beer S/V *High Life*

It will be sailing season before we know it and along with this time of year comes the re-commissioning list of items that need to be checked off. One of these all too important items is the health of your engine cooling system.

I remove the raw water impeller from the pump every fall so that the rubber fins of the impeller don't get a memory from being stuck in the bent position for 6 months and doesn't suck and push the sea water efficiently as it should when you fire up the engine in the spring. I also wire tie the ignition key to the impeller so I don't inadvertently start the engine without the impeller installed.

I replace the impeller every 2 years, needed or not. Cheap insurance and peace of mind. I'm always looking for a good deal and found a company that supplies pumps and parts at an incredible price. Such a great price that I decided to buy a new Oberdorfer replacement pump and completely rebuild our existing pump to keep on hand as an emergency backup. Price was over 30% less than any other supplier.

At our last board meeting there was discussion of the Tides Track System. Here's information from the dealer:

Tides Marine manufactures custom mainsail tracks designed to fit any mast. The track is made of Ultra High Molecular Weight material—which means that it is a high-quality plastic that is UV resistant.

To get the proper fit to your mast a series of simple measurements are made and the Tides track is cut to fit into your existing track by feeding it into the slide gate. The track can be installed when the mast is up, though it is a little easier when the mast is down.

To use the track your mainsail must have Tides slides, which are chrome-plated steel. The slides are excellent and they do very well what their name suggests—slide! Your main, especially a fullbattened main, will deploy and drop easily. Your current main would have to be retro-fitted with the Tides slides, which I am happy to do, of course!

The full batten slides require a luff box that the slide screws into, provided by Tides Marine. This provides a solid fitting between the sail and the mast which allows the full battens to just drop rather than kink the sail.

The Tides website is actually really useful and I suggest everyone take a look. If there is anything that is not clear, give me a call. https://www.tidesmarine.com/

One thing to be careful of is the height of your slide gate on the mast. You need at least 10" from the top face of the boom to the bottom of the gate in order to feed the Tides track into your existing track. If the boom is off (or if the mast is down) this is not a problem. If your slide gate is too low, it can be raised with the careful use of a Dremel tool. Any rigger or sailmaker can do it.
