CYA Reported by James Graham

Following is a summary the Chicago Yachting Association meeting, 2/25/21.

Scott Stevenson, general manager, Chicago Harbors, attended and reported the following: He fully anticipates a May 1 opening of Chicago harbors. He sees no reason they cannot open unless there is a drastic worsening of the pandemic. He thinks the opening date will be announced in the next week to 10 days.

They have a COVID-19 task force and Randy Schmidt, CYA commodore, is a member. He believes the boating community on the whole behaved responsibly last year, with less rafting and large-group partying, and he expects a loosening of boat passenger limitations. For example, families living together should not be limited to six on a vessel if they have eight in the family. There may also be exceptions for passengers who are vaccinated.

Current Lake Michigan water levels are 11 inches below the level of February 2020. They project these lower levels will continue but this is, of course, subject to weather patterns. Great news for harbors.

Boat occupancy in the harbors is bouncing back and is only a couple of hundred boats below previous years, which is crucial to maintaining the revenue stream that supports harbor operations. Last year the park district lost millions of dollars because of COVID's impact on boating.

Capital projects are on track to repair damage from winter weather. They expect to finish the Jackson Park breakwater in time for this season.

The Chicago harbor website is undergoing an overhaul that he hopes will be completed in time for the 2021 season. It would give customers an individual login to manage their accounts and pay bills. It would also be mobile-device friendly. In answer to questions, Scott said he expects Internet service to remain status quo in the harbors. As new slips are added, wired internet is included at those slips.

> • Scott noted that he recently visited Skipper Buds North Point and saw they have practically no inventory. He said boat sales in the area have been brisk.
