
Zoom Meeting & Program Shipwrecks of the Great Lakes August 17

Turn **on** your computer/laptop/phone for a Zoom General Meeting on August 17 at 7pm. Our speaker will be Michael Schumacher the author of 12 books and 25 documentaries on the shipwrecks that have occurred in the Great Lakes. His book *The Wreck of the Carl D* recounts the sinking of a limestone carrier on November 18, 1958. Caught in one of the most violent storms in Lake Michigan history the *Carl D* broke in two and sank in less than five minutes. Four of the 35-person crew escaped to a small raft, to which they clung in total darkness, braving 30-foot waves and frigid temperatures. As the storm raged on, a search-and-rescue mission hunted for survivors, while the frantic citizens of nearby Rogers City, Michigan, the hardscrabble town that was home to 26 members of the *Carl D*. *Bradley's* crew,



anxiously awaited word of their loved ones' fates. Schumacher reconstructs the terrible accident, perilous search, and chilling aftermath for the small Michigan town so intimately affected by the tragedy. Among his other 11 books are *Mighty Fitz: The Sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald* and *Torn in Two: The Sinking of the Daniel J. Morrell.* Don't miss this fascinating program! Following is a summary of the Chicago Yachting Association meeting on July 21.

- July 29-Aug 1 will be a busy lakefront weekend. Those are the dates of Lollapalooza at Grant Park, and July 31 is the date of a big rafting and beach party at the Playpen
- Dave Matthews Band plays Northerly Island Aug. 6-7.
- No full Air and Water Show this year, but the Blue Angels perform Sat., Aug. 22, noon-1 p.m. They rehearse Fri., Aug. 21.

- Classic Boat Rendezvous is Aug, 29th, 10 a.m. - 2 p.m., Chicago River in front of City Winery.
- Some harbors have had mechanical problems with parking gate access. These include Burnham Harbor, where the problems have been intermittent and thus harder to diagnose, and Belmont, where a gate arm was stuck in the up position. As Belmont is repaired, access can be made through the public side of the lot. Hoping for repairs to be finished by early next week.
- Jackson's channel needs dredging and Westrec is seeking permits for the work. The yacht club's representative requested an update on a suggestion that an interim solution be tried involving a tug boat towing a rake to smooth out bumps. More to come.
- The CYA Commodore and others expressed concern about the city's process for approving a Venetian night on the river, when CYA's request to do a similar lakefront event was denied. The river event was canceled due to weather, but the concern remains about a process that inexplicably allowed one but not the other.

The meeting was abbreviated because it was the board's first in-person meeting in many months, held at the Museum Shores Yacht Club, with several participating by Zoom (myself included as I was out of town). Technical problems cut the meeting short for those online.
