

A MESSAGE FROM THE COMMODORE

Don't you wish we could drag anchors to slowdown the passing of summer and sailing season? It goes by so quickly up here in the northern latitudes. I'm hoping those of us going on the Wisconsin Shore Cruise will get to do more than enough sailing, weather permitting. And for those staying near your home ports, I hope you get plenty of sailing in, too.

As the season rolls on, it seems there's always something needing attention, whether a repair or an improvement. One of the best things about owning a Catalina is that you own a Catalina. I mean, they make a great product as we all know, but what really makes Catalina standout is that they seem to personally care more about the owners of their products than any company I've ever dealt with. And it doesn't matter whether you're the second, third or even fourth owner.

A few springs ago, I had a crack appear where the keel meets the hull. Fairly or not, this is known among owners as the Catalina smile. Some online research via the Catalina 320 International Association site said tightening the bolts that connect the keel to the hull was needed. What I couldn't find was agreement on was how much tightening was needed.

So, I called Catalina and surprisingly, they connected me to Gerry Douglas, Catalina's chief designer, who has since retired. "Ninety-five foot pounds," he said. I was a little stunned that I was talking with the person who designed our 320. I stammered, "Not something more, like 105?" He simply repeated, "Ninety-five foot pounds." I had my answer. And I was able to borrow a torque wrench from the Catalina 320 International Association—only had to pay for shipping.

A great person to know at Catalina is Warren Pandy (warren@catalinayachts.com). Over the past year, he's graciously advised me on solutions to a problem I was having with my cabin sole. On the discussion boards, he's always mentioned as someone to contact when you have questions about your Catalina. Please don't retire too soon, Warren!

Get out there and enjoy your Catalina.

RIGGING & EQUIPMENT

Trouble free Pump-outs

Following simple practices can eliminate most problems associated with difficulties during pump-outs.

- 1) Get everything set before starting the pump: Secure the boat; put on gloves; bring water hose to the boat with the shutoff valve turned on; remove the deck plate; and remove the entire vacuum hose from its rack and lay it flat on the dock.
- 2) Start the vacuum pump allowing up to 20 seconds to build vacuum; insert and hold the nozzle firmly in the hole being sure the hose is 90 degrees to the outlet; quickly open the valve; if flow does not begin within 15 to 20 seconds, close the valve, let the vacuum build up again, then again quickly open the valve. If flow still does not begin, add fresh water using the hose then try again being sure to apply adequate pressure to the nozzle to get good vacuum. If you hear leakage, ensure the nozzle is squarely in the hole and apply more pressure.
- 3) When the pump-out hose begins to jump, close the nozzle valve and remove; add fresh water using the water hose for 30 seconds; then repeat the vacuuming extraction process.

Note: Be sure to back flush the holding tank vent line a few times per year to ensure it remains clear.

4) Once complete with the pump-out, lower the vacuum hose into the water, open the valve for 10 seconds, then close the valve and turn off the pump. Reinstall the deck plate and wash down the area with the fresh water hose. Return all hoses to their proper storage places.
